Minutes: Senator John T. Traynor, Chairman, called the meeting to order. Roll call was taken and all committee members present. Sen. Traynor requested meeting starts with testimony on the bill:

Testimony in Support of HB 1251

Rep Lois Delmore - Dist 43 Introduced Bill This bill is in lue of 911 and any concern we may have with contaminants in our computers/system.

Sen. Nelson stated would this be a virus? Yes

Discussion of how to trace viruses. (meter 36)

Sen. Dever asked why we give such a small penalty. The damage that they do can be so much more severe for the act of the crime.

Sen. Trenbeath discussed that paragraph 3, page 1 allowing a person being damaged to be limited until criminal action. Under civil law they may bring action to that person at anytime with or without a civil conviction. Discussion (meter 44.4)
