This bill would remove the limits on the amount the DOT pays for reestablishing a displaced business. The DOT is involved in about six such actions each biennium. It is estimated this bill would increase the cost per reestablishment by about \$20,000. Thus, this bill would increase the cost of reestablishments by a total of \$120,000.

Reestablishments are primarily federally funded. Even though the total costs of reestablishment will increase by \$120,000, the total federal funding available to the DOT will not increase. Therefore, an increase to the cost of reestablishment will have to be offset by a corresponding decrease in capital asset expenditures. Thus, this bill will have no net fiscal impact on the DOT.
