SENATOR JUDY LEE opened the public hearing for HB 1306 relating to misrepresentation as to status as an emergency medical services personnel.

REPRESENTATIVE TODD PORTER, from District 34, introduced HB 1306. This bill puts into code a penalty for misrepresentation of one's self as an emergency medical technician. ... Instances where people have not kept up their certification to help a person as an EMT, getting in front of an actual certified EMT ... actual cases documented ... Questions and discussion with committee ... (Tape 1, Side A, Meter # 5812 - end and Side B, Meter 0 - 140)

REPRESENTATIVE SEVERSON testified in support of the bill. This is a public safety issue. (Meter # 148- 252)

KEITH SORENSON, Legislative Lobbyist for ND EMS Association, testified in favor. (Written testimony) (Meter # 272 - 483)

SENATOR LEE asked Mr. Sorenson to review the differences between the categories.

Answered other questions from committee members regarding first responders, going beyond scope of practice, medical ethics question, coverage under "Good Samaritan" law, basic EMT in training - not certified, "gray area" ...
