PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3037

Page 1, line 1, after "resolution" replace the remainder of the resolution with "directing the Legislative Council to study the needs of individuals with mental illness, drug and alcohol addictions, and physical or developmental disabilities, including individuals with multiple needs, and how the state responds to those needs; the long-term plans for the State Hospital, the Developmental Center at Westwood Park, Grafton, the state's correctional facilities, and other state facilities and the relationships among those facilities; and the impact and availability of community services.

WHEREAS, changes in clinical practices and service delivery systems have created a need for new and different responses in caring for individuals with mental illness and drug and alcohol addictions; and

WHEREAS, over the past decade, more community-based mental health treatment, service, and support options have been developed to support an individual's recovery in or near the individual's own community; and

WHEREAS, a 2002 study of the operations and facilities of the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation projected that the number of inmates in the state's prison system will continue to grow by approximately three percent annually, resulting in an additional 415 offenders by 2012; and

WHEREAS, the 2002 study indicated that for the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to avoid a critical prison capacity shortfall, especially for the female offenders, additional bed space is necessary;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Legislative Council study the needs of individuals with mental illness, drug and alcohol addictions, and physical or developmental disabilities, including individuals with multiple needs, and how the state responds to those needs; the long-term plans for the State Hospital, the Developmental Center at Westwood Park, Grafton, the state's correctional facilities, and other state facilities and the relationships among those facilities; and the impact and availability of community services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in conducting the study, the Legislative Council solicit testimony from interested parties, including citizens, administrators and staff at state and community facilities, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, advocacy groups, and the governing boards of state facilities providing services to those individuals; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council may contract with an independent party to conduct the study; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly."
