Minutes:

Chairman Herbel opened the hearing on SB 2310.

John Olsrud: Director of the Legislative Counsel. Senator Stenehjem called and said he was unable to be here and he is the prime sponsor and he asked me to come. We do not normally come and explain bills unless we are asked. I am here to explain the bill. Sometime late last summer in the mail we got a check addressed to the ND State Senate for \$500 in memory of Warner Wesson, who was a State Senator from Fargo. We advised Senator Stenehjem at that time that we do not believe there is any authority to spend that money that comes to the state. We could put it into the general fund, but that would not meet the intent of the gift so we have thought about a number of things. The state itself does not have a foundation, the heritage center does, but again that would not meet the intent of the donor in this case. That we would launder the funds through the Heritage Fund Foundation or something so we just held the check so the Senator Stenehjem with the other three leaders introduced this bill. It is very specific to this kind of thing. Each house may accept donations depending on who the donation comes from. The senate committee did consider amending this to make it more flexible and for whatever reason they did not. So that is the bill.

Rep. William Kretschmar: What if the gift came to the ND Legislative Assembly?

John Olsrud: Presumably we would hold that check till the next session. Who knows, this is very unusual and I think a lot of people have the idea you can give money to government and there is even a question to whether it is tax deductible? If it is a 501C3, which I assume the Heritage Center Foundation is, if you write a check to the government or state that check should go to the general fund, subject to appropriations under the constitution. This is very specific for this kind of donation.

Rep. Nancy Johnson: Could the senate vote to donate the money to a 501b3 like a Heritage Center?

John Olsrud: The Senate could do whatever it pleased. What I would advise; we have to be aware of the intent of the donor. The check said it was for the senate; so the senate is going to have to decide what to do with the check. If they would say lets donate it to the Heritage Center, I would say I am not sure that is the intent of the donor.

Rep. Kim Koppelman: So that both the house and senate would have to approve the appropriation even though the check might be made out to one chamber or the other is that correct?

John Olsrud: Both the house and senate have to pass this bill for it to become law. If it becomes law it says upon motion of the appropriate house. It is a continuing appropriation so this money would be spent presumably this session, there would be a motion in the Senate. Any further donations would be approved by the appropriate chamber.

Rep. Kim Koppelman: It is probably not practical to hold a check for 1 ½ year because it may not be good by the time you cash it so could we somehow receive the funds and held until the next session so the motion could be made. If the motion is to receive the donation and then to appropriate it most cases it would be a stale check.

John Olsrud: I am not certain I can answer that, but I would assume if this passes in the future we would then be able to advise and say there is a mechanism if another check came we would be able to deposit that subject to the motion to the exception. But as of now there is not vehicle for us to go on.

Senator Stenehjem: Mr. Olsrud had done a good job explaining what this bill does. If it went directly to one chamber they could decide what to do with the money. Basically that is what this bill does.

Chairman Herbel: I suppose it could even be used for a memorial service in both houses a week from Monday?

Senator Stenehjem: It could be used for that if you choose to do so. In the piece of legislation our intention was just if a check came in we would have a decision on the floor of each chamber we could do that. I don't know if that is the use I would like to see but if you wanted to put a memorial plaque in there or a grave seal plaque or something we wanted to do extra for the chamber we could do it.

Senator O'Connell: (see testimony #1)

Rep. Boucher: I am in support of the intent of the family. That is why I think it is important to follow the wishes of the family. I think it is important the acknowledgement that we received this money and what was the intent of those people bequeathing the money and I don't think it should be a difficult problem, but if Senate Bill 2310 helps clear up that kind of situation I think that is the appropriate way and I would certainly recommend to this committee a do pass on this legislature and the house follows suite and does the same.

That is the extent of it.

Rep. William Kretschmar moved the amendment Seconded By Rep. Kim Koppelman Discussion: Went through it again.

Rep. Lawrence Klemin: Discussion on amendment.

Chairman Herbel: Let's just hold it until we get the language right. Rep. Kim Koppelman If you and Rep. William Kretschmar want to get together so that we cover everything that would be good. Would you withdraw the motions then and we will hang onto it.

Both motions were withdrawn.



SB 2310 Summary

Senator David P. O'Connell



SB 2310 allows the legislative authority to accept and expend donations; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to declare an emergency.

Each house in the legislative assembly may accept funding donations.

Funds received from a member or former member, the estate of a member or former member or as a memorial in the name of a member or a former member of the legislative assembly may be expended by the appropriate house upon motion.

All funds under this section are appropriated as a continuing appropriation for the purposes contained in the motion approving the expenditure of the funds.
