**Representative Bellew:** Sponsor. Support. If this bill is passed it would extend the property tax credit for disabled veterans no matter what percent they are disabled. I believe this is a good thing to do for our veterans. Always remember that these are service related disabilities. I read a bumper sticker once and it read "If you can read this thank a teacher. If you are reading this is English thank a soldier." I urge a Do Pass on this bill.

**John Jacobsen, Chairman of the Legislative Committee of the North Dakota Veterans Coordinating Council.** Support. Please refer to attached testimony #1.

**Representative Bette Grande:** Don't we have this disabled veteran's property tax in Government and Veterans Affairs too? It is a very similar bill where we changed the definition.

**John Jacobsen:** It just changed terminology from value to taxable value.

**Representative Dwight Wrangham:** I don't remember the bill number but we have a bill in Governmental and Veterans Affairs. It includes in the definition some other aspect of being disabled that VA [precludes you from holding a job.

**John Jacobsen:** I'm not sure about that. I didn't read that part of it from the bill. The real value was changed to taxable value. The value went from \$125,000 down to \$5400 which would be the taxable value.

**Chairman Wesley R. Belter:** That is correct and that bill has already passed the House floor.

**John Jacobsen:** This one just removes the 50% disability and opens it up to all disabled veterans.

**Representative Bette Grande:** I would like to reconcile the bills. We have a bill that's going to affect this one so we'll have to figure it out in order to reconcile them.

**Chairman Wesley R. Belter:** No further testimony. Closed hearing on HB 1306.

HB 1306 would extend the property tax credit for disabled veterans to those veterans with any level of service-connected disability.

## NORTH DAKOTA VETERANS COORDINATING COUNCIL

My name is John L. Jacobsen. I am the Chairman of the Legislative Committee of the North Dakota Veterans Coordinating Council. I am also a member of the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

I served in the North Dakota National Guard and the US Army Reserve for a total of 30 years. I retired in 1995 as a Colonel. I served on Active Duty in 1991 during Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm in the Persian Gulf, stationed in the United Arab Emirates.

The Coordinating Council is made up of 15 members, 3 from each of the five Veterans Organizations in North Dakota:

- American Legion
- AMVETS
- Disabled American Veterans
- Veterans of Foreign Wars
- Vietnam Veterans of America

It is the policy of the Coordinating Council to support legislation that will benefit the welfare of the members of the Armed Forces. The committee **MUST** concur totally, that is all 15 members must agree on the legislation to be supported or else it does not get the support.
