 We might expect to see more students target CTE courses to obtain the scholarship which would probably take a couple years to see that effect.  
 We are not optimistic the 231 identified students would ever be seen.  
 We may see students shift from the academic to the CTE as well.

**Representative Marie Strinden:** District 18, introduced HB 1419. It is a workforce scholarship bill. We want to get more students into our workforce and we did not want to touch the 4 year schools.

**Rep. Mock:** Do you know the requirement to retain eligibility what GPA they need to retain the scholarship?

**Representative Strinden:** I was intending 2.5 GPA.

**Rep. Schreiber Beck:** Did you have conversations with the Career and Technical Education administrators?

**Representative Strinden:** No, I did not speak to the them.

**Rep. Rohr:** How many students would it impact in our Higher Education?

**Representative Strinden:** Around 1000 students.

**Chairman Nathe:** Why would we want to lower the bar for receiving scholarships?

**Representative Strinden:** Many of the kids going to our schools are not going to go on to the 4 year institutions or able to. Many will be working in support service industries and they need assistance to reach their goals.

**Rep. Schreiber Beck:** The best and the brightest need to be in our trade tech. I want to correct that thought process that still exists, that it is the lower achieving students that attend the 2 year institutions.

**Representative Strinden:** It wasn't my intent to imply that. I apologize if that is how it seemed.

**Chairman Nathe:** Any support for HB 1419? None. Any opposition to HB 1419? None.  
Recessed HB 1419.

**Rep. Meier:** My concern is for individuals that want to go on to a 4 year institution, if they are at a 'C' average they would not be able to obtain the current grant system that we have in place. I do have a concern with that and I **Move Do Not Pass on HB 1419.**
