This bill requires NDDOT, upon application, to issue a color photo military hunter ID to a nonresident who is active military and previously resided in ND. The ID may be used only to identify a person eligible for a military hunting license under subdivision g of subsection 12 of section 20.1-02-05.

The fiscal impact of this bill cannot be determined because the number of qualifying applicants for a color photo military hunter identification card cannot be determined.

We do know that we would incur estimated one-time computer programming costs of \$15,000 and the cost to produce ID cards is about \$3.10 for each card. We have no way to determine the amount of staff time that would be involved to process each hunter identification.

Vice Chairman Damschen opened on hearing on HB 1246.

Rep. Porter, Dist. 34, Mandan: substance of the bill on Page 3, Line 25 and Page 4, Line 9. As we have dealt with our gratis tag system, land that had been placed into partnerships or farming corporations, was not eligible for moose gratis license. In the deer gratis tag system, it was proportioned out so that entity could get one tag for the land they hold in ownership. That was an oversight. There's another bill to deal with making all those gratis tags the same so they're worded the same inside of code. This bill takes care of that too. This deals mainly with moose.

Vice Chairman Damschen: Questions?

Rep Bosch: Do we need this bill then if we have other bills we may be combining?

Rep. Porter: I think we'll have Rep. Anderson work on the 3 gratis bills to work on in a subcommittee and come out with one that fixes language the same, treats all the situations equally whether a partnership, an individual, in whatever species that qualifies.

Chairman Porter: opened the hearing on HB 1246.

Rep. Anderson: Our subcommittee dealt with HB 1246, HB 1357 and HB 1430. Basically HB 1357 and HB 1430 will be gone and we'll work it under HB 1246. Basically a people in northern Ward and Renville are having issues with moose eating their crop. He went on to explain the amendment, Attachment 1.

Chairman Porter: As a result we've made a consistent policy dealing with gratis tags, how we look at LLCs, LLPs, and Sec.3 describes active military individual who is a former resident in the state, that can hunt.

Rep. Anderson: we also added a new section for a management study of gratis hunting license / system.

On HB 1357, the director may issue special depredation licenses in areas where people are having trouble with big game animals destroying their crop. The G&F has been consistently increasing the number of license. I'm not sure it's enough to take care of the problems of depredation in some of these areas. If they have standing crop and one of the last ones to harvest, some have a dozen moose on their land. Basically they have said if we don't do something, they'll take care of the problem themselves. I would make a motion to approve amendment 19.0811.01002 to HB 1246.

Rep. Mitskog: Second.

Chairman Porter: We have a motion to amend HB 1246, and a second. Discussion? Voice vote, all those in favor say aye, opposed. Motion carried. We have an amended bill.

Rep. Mitskog: Move a Do Pass as Amended.

Chairman Porter: Discussion? I do think committee, I think important is (1) consistency and (2) study. We heard from a landowner that basically said he's not letting anybody hunt until he gets his license. I think this is a good move towards consistency.

Chair Unruh: Opened the public hearing. Senator Roers was absent.

Representative Dick Anderson, District 6 (0:40-) Introduced the bill. Please see attachment #1 for amendment and #2 for supplemental information. Our committee heard three moose bill, and we rolled them all into one. The first section has an amendment; Representative Damschen had a veteran who wanted to get a turkey license, even though he lived out of the state, we found out we can't do that with the lottery system. This amendment removes all that language. The rest of the bill deals with moose. We did change all the language, who can apply for a gratis tag, we made that consistent through the whole bill for big game. The language was like that for deer. We went in and changed the language for antelope, moose and elk, so it was all identical. The email in **attachment #2** refers to moose units M9, M10 and M11, there is a problem with the moose up there. North of Mohall, they seed their crops in the last 15 days of May, so their crops are standing in October, moose gets into the crop and destroys it. Working with Game and Fish, we've increased number of licenses up there. We put in the bill on page 9 that the director could issue special depredation license to landowners if they had problem with moose in their crops. We also put in a study resolution for gratis tags. Some units in the state take up 80-85% of the eligible license in the unit. There are other areas where they only take up 5%. The idea is to award the landowner, but if the public doesn't have the right to hunt, it gets to be an issue, so Game and Fish thought a gratis tag resolution study would be good, they could figure out what is going on there. It's hard to understand the gratis tag even if you are aware of what's going on. We'd like to put an emergency clause on this to help with the issues they are having with the lottery system. The moose are a huge problem north of Mohall; I've got video of 20 moose running through a canola field, and pictures of 28 bull moose sitting in one field. They go across the border occasionally. They've increased moose license quite a bit in some of the moose units.

Chair Unruh: Will I be able to get a moose tag?

Representative Anderson: What they do is post a flyer in the bar, and if someone sees a moose, they'll call you. The moose are a problem, there's no natural predators.

Senator Cook: I'm looking at the language that allows special moose depredation licenses, they go only to a landowner?

Representative Anderson: It's just meant for the landowner. We are increasing the license in that one unit by 40%, the chances of someone getting a moose tag will go up.

Senator Cook: So, you'd have to have a license and a place to shoot a moose?

Representative Anderson: I'm sure if you had a moose tag, people will help you get a moose up there. They are a problem they want to get rid of. I've never had a non-area hunter have trouble getting a moose.

The card may be used only to identify an individual who is eligible for a military hunting license under subdivision g of subsection 12 of section 20.1-02-05.
2. An application for a military hunter identification card must be made on a form furnished by the director and be accompanied by satisfactory evidence of the individual's service in the military and prior residence in North Dakota.
3. The director shall adopt rules to implement this section.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - GRATIS HUNTING LICENSES. During the 2019-20 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying gratis licenses to hunt deer, antelope, elk, and moose. The study must include consideration of the minimum acreage requirements for a gratis license, restrictions on where individuals with gratis licenses to hunt moose may hunt, how gratis licenses to hunt deer are allocated in units to ensure an adequate supply remains available for individuals with other licenses to hunt deer, and whether eligibility for a gratis license to hunt moose should be annual or once in a lifetime. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-seventh legislative assembly."

Hi Dick,

Here is some additional information on moose and how the Department has responded to a growing population in the northwest....over the last 5 years the Department has done the following:

- The 2018 moose season allocated a record number of moose licenses since the season began in 1977 – 334 licenses (majority of those in m9,10,11)
- The Department split previous moose unit M10 into two units – M11 and M10. This was done to better ‘target’ moose harvest within areas inside of these units
- 334 licenses issued in 2018 was 203 more than licenses issued in the 2015 season – the majority of those licenses went to units M10 and M11 and were antlerless licenses
- The Department implemented a special moose management action after the regular season is over to address site specific depredation/nuisance moose issues. It allows an individual who did not fill their moose license during the regular season to harvest a moose causing damage/problems.
- The Department will again be increasing licenses for the 2019 season in units m10, m11, and m9. For example, in 2018 the Department issued 110 moose licenses in m10, for 2019 that number is likely to be closer to 180 licenses
