

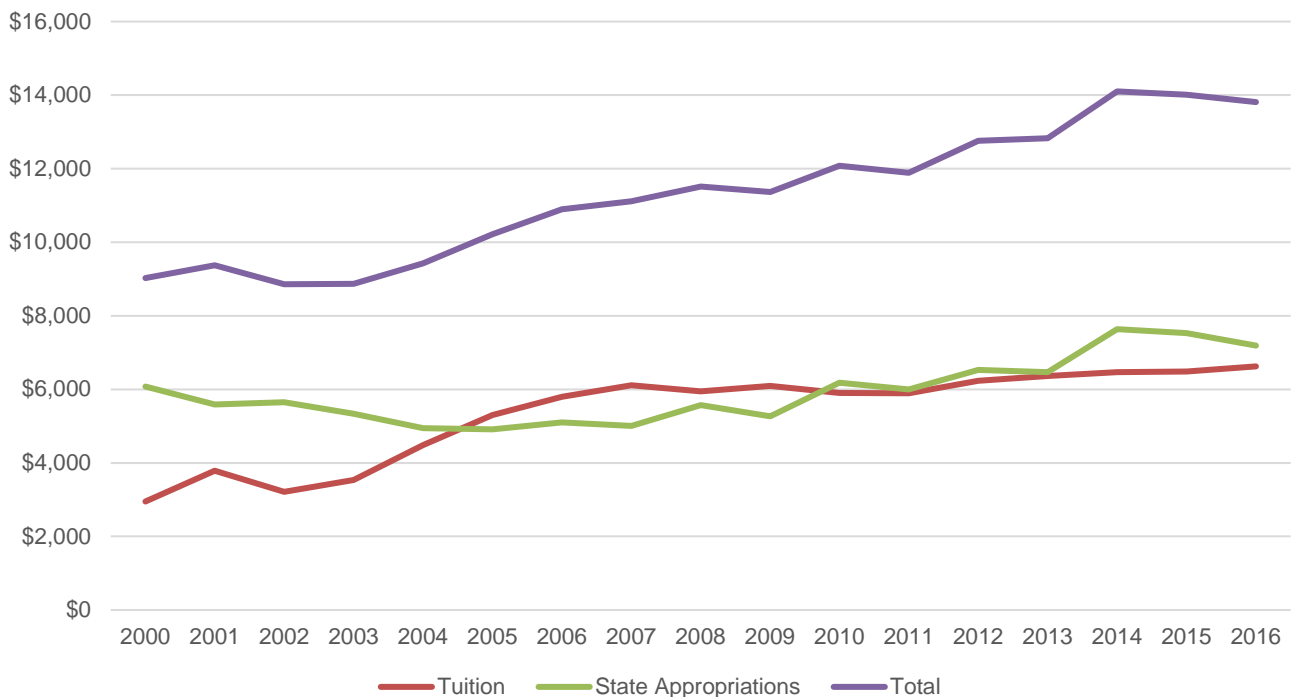
TUITION AND STATE APPROPRIATIONS DATA
