

ESTIMATED AVERAGE ANNUAL COST OF A STATE EMPLOYEE - 2003-05 BIENNIUM

The schedule below provides the estimated average annual cost of a permanent state employee during the 2003-05 biennium. The information is based on agency budget information provided to the 2003 Legislative Assembly. The amounts include classified and nonclassified employees of all state agencies except the higher education institutions. The amounts shown do not reflect costs relating to temporary employees, shift differential, or overtime.

Employees are eligible to receive the following nonmonetary compensation/benefits as part of their state employment:

- Annual leave - North Dakota Century Code Section 54-06-14 - Annual leave for state employees may range from one day per month to two days per month based on years of service.
- Sick leave - North Dakota Century Code Section 54-06-14 - Sick leave for state employees may range from one day per month to 1.5 days per month based on years of service.
- Holidays - North Dakota Century Code Sections 1-03-01 and 1-03-01.1 - State employees receive up to 10.5 paid holidays per year.
