The amendment removes the general fund appropriation and establishes the maximum annual fees and renewal fees for asbestos and lead-based paint contractors (\$100) and examination fees for workers (\$25).

Senate Bill No. 2124 - State Department of Health - Conference Committee Action

The Conference Committee changed the language in the bill to provide that the annual, renewal, and examination fees for lead-based contractors and workers may not exceed those charged to asbestos contractors and workers.
