<sup>1</sup> This amendment removes the Governor's recommendation for state employee salary increases and retains the recommended state payment for health insurance premiums.

<sup>2</sup> This amendment changes the funding source for wildlife services from the general fund to the game and fish fund.

<sup>3</sup> This amendment increases funding for wildlife services from the game and fish fund to a total of \$800,000.

<sup>4</sup> This amendment changes the funding source from the anhydrous ammonia storage inspection fund to the general fund. The increase in the general fund appropriation of \$101,863 is offset by an increase in pet food and livestock medicine registration fees which are anticipated to increase general fund revenues by \$180,500. The total funding to the Agriculture Commissioner from the anhydrous ammonia storage inspection fund is \$54,496.

A section is added that increases the pet food registration fee from \$50 to \$100 for a two-year period. This increase is estimated to generate an additional \$152,500 in general fund revenues.

A section is added that increases the livestock medicine registration fee from \$20 to \$40 for a two-year period. This increase is estimated to generate an additional \$28,000 in general fund revenues.

The section providing for the Agriculture Commissioner's salary increase is removed.

The amendment provides that the Agriculture Commissioner is to be reimbursed from the game and fish fund only after costs have been incurred. The Department of Agriculture may receive up to \$800,000 from the game and fish fund for wildlife services. In addition, the Board of Animal Health may receive up to \$150,000 from the game and fish fund.

<sup>1</sup> This amendment reduces funding for Project Safe Send by \$309,762, from \$619,525 to \$309,763. This amendment also provides for the project to be conducted only in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, and the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006, and for the project to be effective through July 31, 2007.

<sup>2</sup> This amendment changes \$400,000 of funding for wildlife services from the game and fish fund to the general fund. The total funding for wildlife services is \$400,000 from the general fund and \$400,000 from the game and fish fund.

<sup>3</sup> This amendment provides \$25,000 from the environment and rangeland protection fund for expenses of the Crop Protection Product Harmonization and Registration Board.

<sup>4</sup> This amendment adjusts the removal of the executive recommendation for salary increases to reflect the salaries within the Board of Animal Health, state meat inspection, and Safe Send line items. The Senate amendment removed all of the funding from the salaries and wages line item.

<sup>5</sup> This amendment changes \$50,000 of funding for the Board of Animal Health from the game and fish fund to the general fund. The total funding for the Board of Animal Health from the game and fish fund is \$100,000, which is to be reimbursed to the Department of Agriculture on a fee-for-service basis.

<sup>6</sup> This amendment reduces funding for information technology by \$30,072 from the general fund, which represents a reduction in information technology funding from the general fund of approximately 20 percent.

<sup>7</sup> Funding for state employee health insurance premiums is reduced from \$493 per month to \$488.70 per month.

The House amendment incorporates the provisions of Senate Bill No. 2398, which transfers \$200,000 from the environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund, available to the Crop Protection Product Harmonization and Registration Board as a continuing appropriation pursuant to North Dakota Century Code Section 4-35-06.3.

<sup>1</sup> The House amendment reduces funding for Project Safe Send by \$309,762, from \$619,525 to \$309,763 and provides for the project to be conducted only in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, and the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006, and for the project to be effective through July 31, 2007. The Conference Committee provided that Project Safe Send can be conducted annually, however the funding for the project did not change from the House version.

<sup>2</sup> The Conference Committee provided funding for wildlife services totaling \$800,000, \$550,000 from the game and fish fund and \$250,000 from the general fund. The House amendment reduced the funding for wildlife services from the game and fish fund by \$400,000 from the Senate version and provided funding of \$400,000 from the general fund.

<sup>3</sup> This amendment provides \$25,000 from the environment and rangeland protection fund for expenses of the Crop Protection Product Harmonization and Registration Board.

<sup>4</sup> This amendment adjusts the removal of the executive recommendation for salary increases to reflect the salaries within the Board of Animal Health, state meat inspection, and Safe Send line items. The Senate amendment removed all of the funding from the salaries and wages line item.

<sup>5</sup> This amendment reduces funding for information technology by \$7,518 from the general fund and \$1,329 from special funds, which represents a reduction in information technology funding from the general fund and special funds of approximately 5 percent.

<sup>6</sup> Funding for state employee health insurance premiums is reduced from \$493 to \$488.70 per month.

<sup>7</sup> The Conference Committee provided that the agriculture in the classroom program should be contracted with outside organizations or individuals. This amendment moves existing authority of \$10,000 for the program from the salaries and wages line item to the operating line item. The total funding for the program is \$50,000 from the environment and rangeland protection fund, \$5,000 of carryover authority from the Attorney General refund fund, and \$116,000 of special funds spending authority from fundraising activities. The Department of Agriculture is to provide a minimum of \$100,000 in contracts for the agriculture in the classroom program, and shall use existing operating appropriation authority if unable to generate the needed funds from grants, contracts, or other fundraising activities.

The House amendment incorporates the provisions of Senate Bill No. 2398, which transfers \$200,000 from the environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund, available to the Crop Protection Product Harmonization and Registration Board as a continuing appropriation pursuant to North Dakota Century Code Section 4-35-06.3. The Conference Committee did not change this amendment.

The Conference Committee provided \$150,000 for the Board of Animal Health from the game and fish fund, the same as the Senate version. The House amendment provided funding of \$100,000 from the game and fish fund and \$50,000 from the general fund for the Board of Animal Health.

The Conference Committee provided \$50,000 from the environment and rangeland protection fund for the agriculture in the classroom program, replacing \$50,000 of special funds appropriation from fundraising.
