HOSPITALS USING ACCOUNTABLE CARE ORGANIZATIONS

This memorandum provides information regarding Accountable Care Organizations (ACO) and the number of hospitals in the state that have an ACO. An ACO is a group of doctors, hospitals, and other health care providers, that voluntarily come together to give coordinated care to patients. The goals of coordinated care are to provide patients with the right care at the right time without unnecessary duplication of services, and to prevent medical errors. Accountable Care Organization programs that are offered by Medicare include the Medicare Shared Savings Program, the Advance Payment ACO Model, and the Pioneer ACO Model.

- Shared Savings Program The Medicare Shared Savings Program was established by Section 3022 of the federal Affordable Care Act. The program is a key component of the Medicare delivery system reform initiatives that are included in the Affordable Care Act. Congress created the program to facilitate coordination and cooperation among providers to improve the quality of care for Medicare fee-for-service beneficiaries and reduce costs. Eligible providers, hospitals, and suppliers may participate in the program by creating or participating in an ACO.
- Advance Payment ACO Model The Advance Payment ACO Model is designed for physician-based and rural providers who have come together
 voluntarily to provide coordinated care to Medicare patients. Through this model, selected participants may receive upfront and monthly payments that
 can be used to make investments in their care coordination infrastructure.
- Pioneer ACO Model The Pioneer ACO Model is designed for health care organizations and providers that are already experienced in coordinating care
 for patients across care settings. The model allows provider groups to move more rapidly from a shared savings payment model to a population-based
 payment model. The model is designed to work with private payers by aligning provider incentives, and cost savings for Medicare, employers, and
 patients.

The following schedule provides information relating to hospitals in the state participating with an ACO based on information available from the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
